



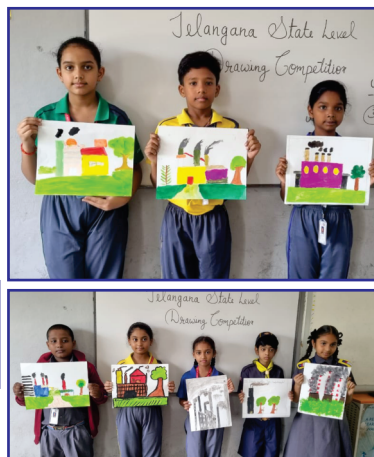
Independence Day Celebrations
