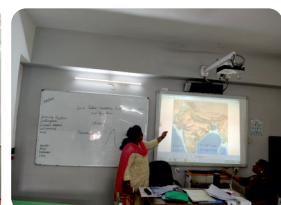
In conclusion, the Circle Time session was lucrative and encouraging. This helped us to review our previous efforts and plan for the future.

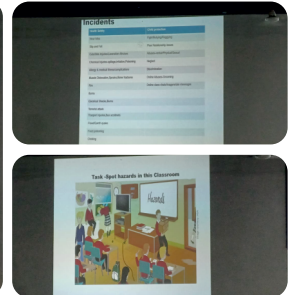
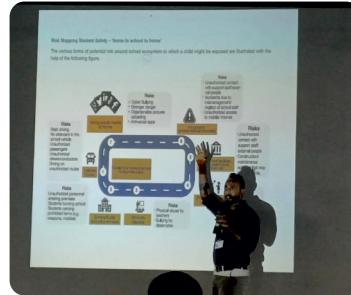
External Achievements
