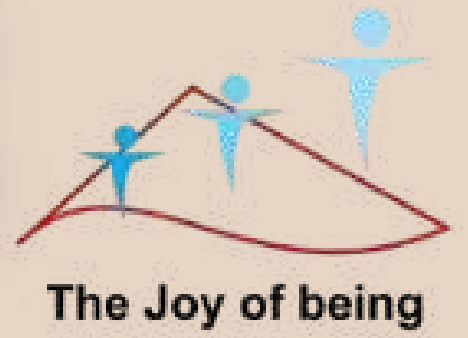

During this period, the students prepared with great care and sincerity. They planned their study time properly, revised their lessons regularly, and worked hard to perform well in their examinations.

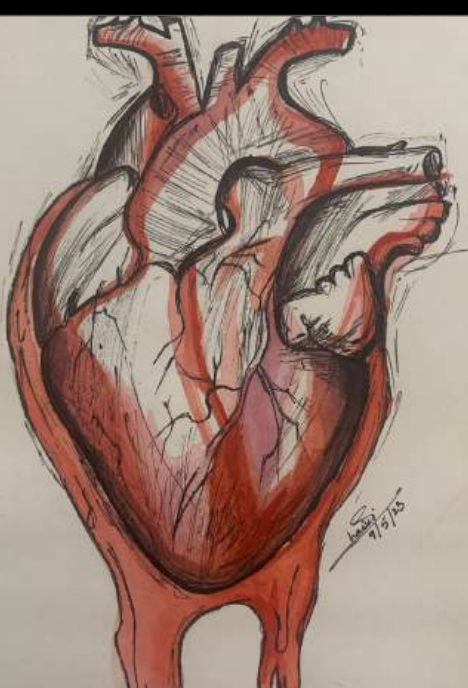

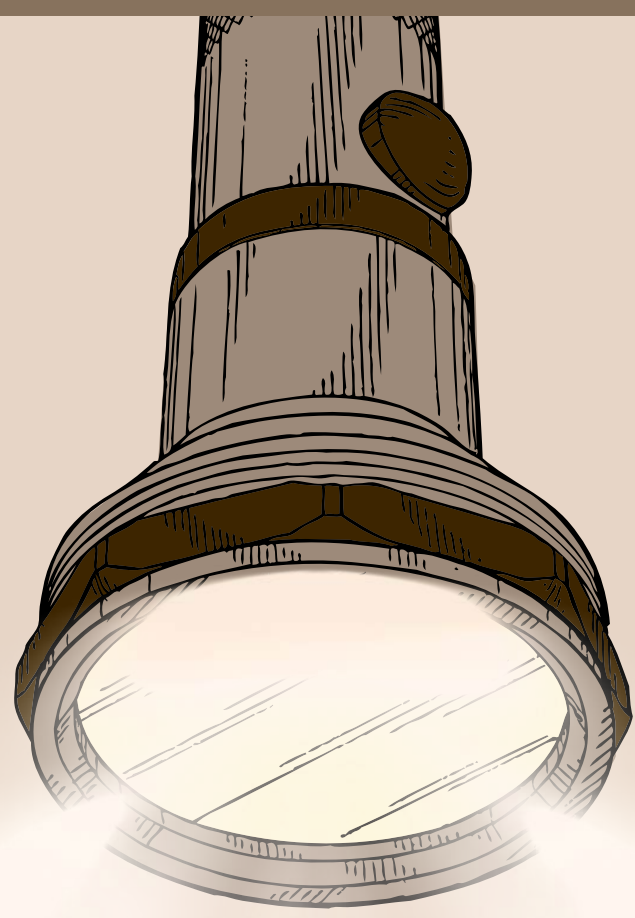
FAREWELL PRACTICE

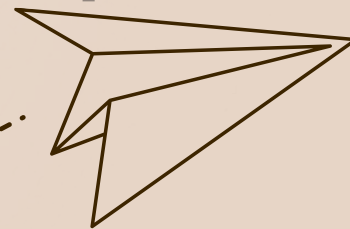
