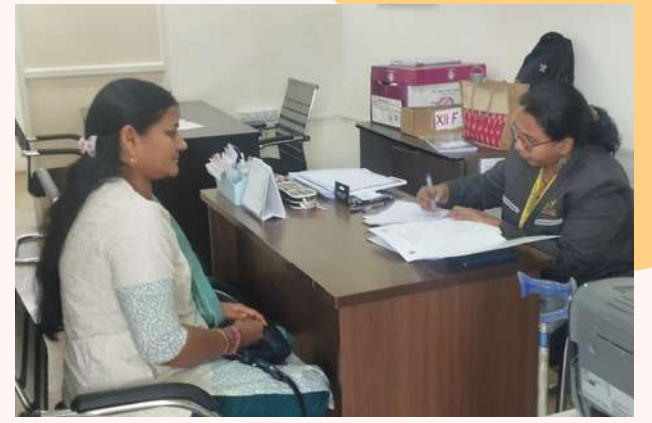
# PARENT - TEACHER MEETING



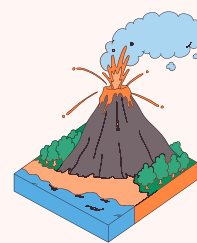

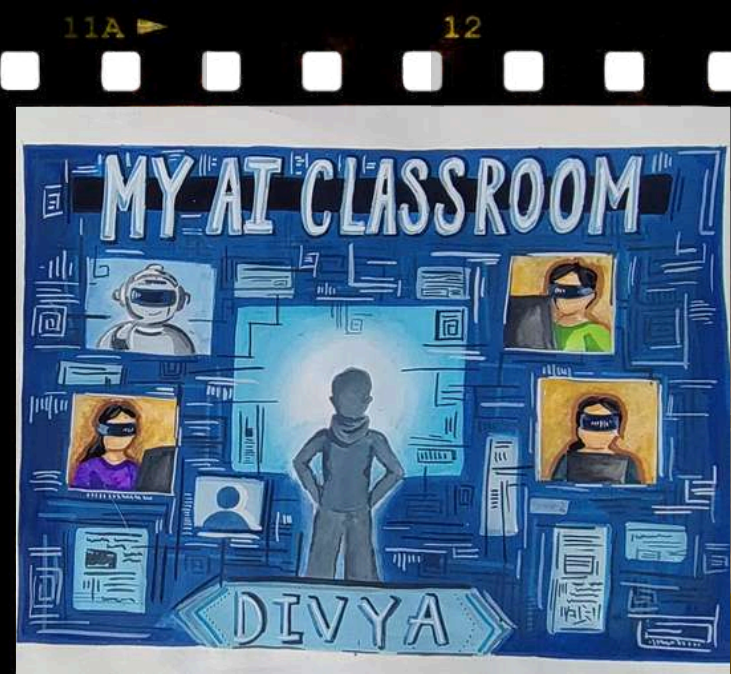
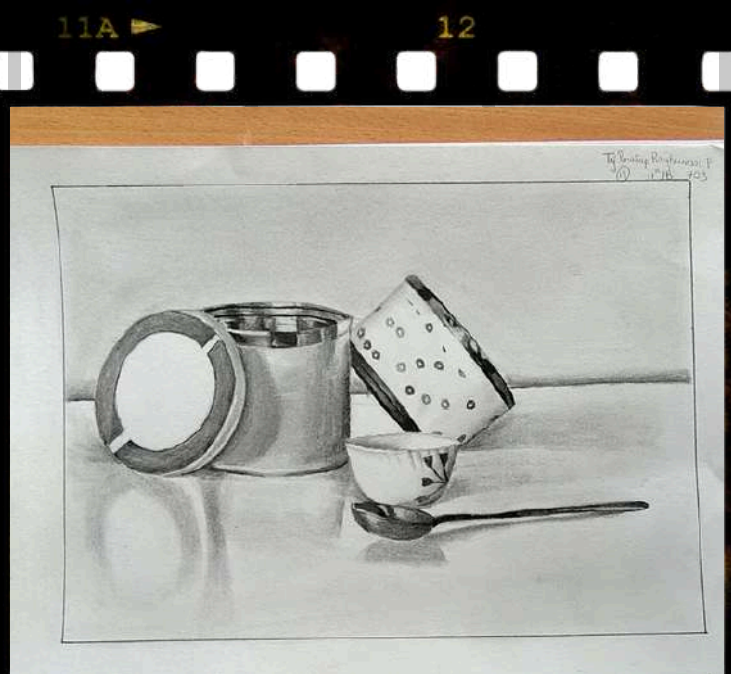
